

Open The Book How did you hear your first Bible story? Was it on your mum, dad or grandma's knee? Was it in Sunday school or maybe day school? Children love stories, and so many children could miss out on the great classic stories from the Bible – Noah, Daniel and the life of Jesus could be closed chapters if youngsters don't get an opportunity to

engage with the Bible. Open The Book is a national storytelling project that began in 1999. The main aim is "To enable children to hear the stories of the Bible in their primary school years" It is simple, effective, engaging, inexpensive – and fun! The stories are shared weekly by teams of local Christians, using a variety of costumes, props and often involving the children themselves.

It is a three year rolling programme delivered at no charge to the schools. Here in Kendal teams of around 4 or 5 people made up of Christians from St George's, Holy Trinity, St Thomas', United Reform and the Methodist churches have just completed their third year of OpenThe Book stories in three schools. Vicarage Park, Burneside and Selside. All three school want us to continue in September so we will be revisiting the Year 1 stories. Due to people moving away or just unable to be part of OTB anymore we often find ourselves short and would love some new people to join us. Our greatest need is St Oswald's Burneside on Thursday mornings from 9.30 till 10.45am and Selside on Monday afternoons from 2 till 3.15pm. A weekly commitment is not essential. We pray that as the children watch and listen to the stories shared so enthusiastically by those who love God and his word, they too will learn about the God who loves each of them.
