

Flood Tapestry: Yes, the Flood Tapestry has arrived at Cornerstone and is on display in the Hub. Please take your after service cuppa and have a look at this awesome work of art that has been created by people from all walks of life in Kendal.

At the start, many had no artistic expertise or needlework skills but they all had memories of Storm Desmond and how it had affected them.

Last Saturday, some 40 people, including Tim Farron welcomed the Tapestry to Cornerstone where it will be staying for some weeks. We have added some reflective, written content that has been placed on the seats. If you have any ideas on how this might develop please discuss this with either the Stewards, Reverend Tricia or with Dorothy.


It is hoped that as many people as possible will visit Cornerstone to see and to enjoy this unique piece of art but at the same time, we to protect the Tapestry, which is fragile and non-washable. To achieve both these aims, the red chairs have been arranged facing the Tapestry in a semicircle. It is really important that this format is maintained, as we are responsible for its safe keeping during the stay here. The chairs can be moved closer to the Tapestry to create more passage space but a protective ring needs to be in place.
