# CREATING OUR FUTURE TOGETHER

### Cumbria Methodist District

On Saturday July 8 th 2023, around 50 people from across Cumbria gathered in Penrith to discuss how best to shape ourselves for the season ahead. This is the question which has been taxing a good number of folk in recent months

The meeting was called to discuss a proposal to become one circuit across Cumbria Some of the reasons given were:

- · to form a more missional shape to our structures
- to remove a level of administration
- to lessen the burden of trustee responsibilities with the centralising of those offices that can best be done once by an experienced team rather than us all having to fend for ourselves.

After discussion in groups looking at leadership and mission; worship and ministry; property; finance, the meeting re-convened to vote on how much energy there was (on a scale of 0 to 5) to pursue the one circuit proposal.

I think its fair to say there was a consensus that we need to do something differently, while a number of gueries over the details, and the timescale remain.

### **Next Steps**

- The working group will reflect on what was raised and produce a further briefing before the
  proposal is discussed at Synod (biannual gathering of ordained and lay reps from across the
  Cumbria District) on Sept 9 th.
- Depending on the outcome of that gathering, the proposal will then need to be discussed at Circuit and Church level.

# BRINGING THE BIBLE TO LIFE

Open the Book - Bible Society

"A Bible story well told has the power to spark the imagination, give hope, create a smile, teach important lessons and connect generations."

Open the Book is a storytelling project that goes into schools to share Bible stories with children in a way that is fun, interactive and memorable. Teams (4 or 5 people) of trained and safely recruited volunteers from local churches use The Storytelling Bible which contains 90 scripted stories from Genesis to Revelation, told over a 3 year cycle.

Within our local area, teams currently visit Burneside, Grayrigg, Sellside and Vicarage Park schools one day per week to take the collective assembly. They would love to be able to visit others as well.

I recently met with Helen Proudfoot who liaises with the schools and co-ordinate visits.

There are a number of ways we can support this part of the work of the Kingdom:
